Administration Manager Krok related Authority staff's recommendation that, with the exception of Hawthorne, Motorola modems be used in future vehicle build outs. He advised that new modems will be necessary to program radios via Wi-Fi on the forthcoming Interoperability Network of the South Bay (INSB) and verified that specifications for the Motorola modems will be distributed to the member/contract police departments. In answer to questions from the Police Task Force members, Administration Manager Krok clarified that Blue Tooth capability would not be affected with the Motorola modems and that the cost of the Motorola modems would be similar to that of the current modems.

It Technician Rosales advised that Hawthorne is looking into the idea of testing the Motorola modem due to their dissatisfaction with their current modem.

Operations Manager Kauffman gave a Power Point presentation on Text to 9-1-1, which will be deployed in Los Angeles County on December 1, 2017. She discussed that the Text to 9-1-1 system does not currently have language translation capability; that cellular phones must have a data plan in order to use Text to 9-1-1; that the Text to 9-1-1 system might not be as quick as a telephone call; and that it will be possible to obtain transcripts for the Text to 9-1-1 messages.
