### 4. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

#### a. Minutes – February 24, 2021

Motion: Lt. Brock moved to approve the minutes from February 24, 2021. The motion was seconded by Manhattan Beach and passed by voice vote.

### 5. GENERAL BUSINESS

#### a. Mark43 CAD Update

Administrative Services Manager Krok updated Mark43 to indicate a 30-month timeline until kick-off. Cities need to ensure the installation of Windows 10 for a working CAD system. Operations Manager Kauffman will require vetting of the access list. Fleet data will also need to be updated and closer engagement with the cities will take place in the coming months. New builds will have the 5Gs to meet minimum standards.

#### b. Police Dispatching Procedures

- 3SI Tracker – Operations Manager Kauffman reported the 211L do not say GPS activation. With the encryption, the task force needs to discuss changing or maintaining same procedure.
- NARC Calls – Currently, not on the air, only on the MDC. Any feedback to continue or to putting on the air. Table discussion until the next task force. Hawthorne expressed, with the encryption channels, the information should be broadcasted over the air for these procedures should the task force agree. Culver City channel 1 is still not encrypted and will update once it is encrypted.

6. **COMMENTS FROM TASK FORCE MEMBERS**

Mr. Armstrong reminded Task Force about Active 911 is available which is an alert on the cell phone for \$12.50 per user per year. Hawthorne has 46 active users. Culver City Fire has over 70 users. Manhattan has 16. It is an app regardless of iOS or Android. Attach global group or city to it and receive notifications from operators of call number and location. Operations Manager Kauffman confirmed calls on the MDC will go to the cell phone without the supplements.
